



Loring Air Force Base

Location: Located 4½ mi NW of Limestone, ME, about 160 mi NNE of Bangor, ME.

Name: Named in honor of Maj Charles Joseph Loring, Jr, (1918–1952), a native of Portland, ME. Awarded the Medal of Honor posthumously, Major Loring was killed in Korea on 22 Nov 1952 when he deliberately crashed his crippled F-80 into a gun emplacement on Sniper Ridge.

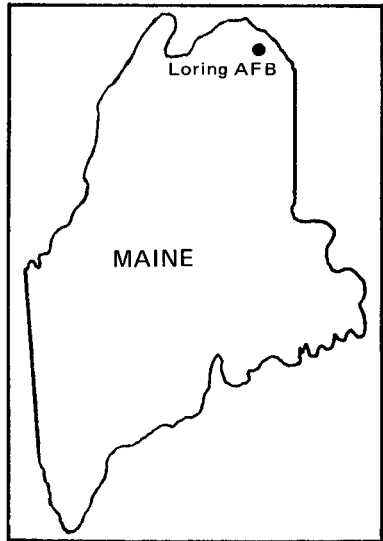

Major Changes in Operational Capability: First runway completed 30 Nov 1948; facilities to accommodate B-36 operations completed Dec 1950; 25-bed (later increased to 50-bed) hospital opened Jun 1953; major modifications, extensions of runways and other operational concrete surfaces (main runway lengthened to over 12,000 feet), and new hangars and maintenance shops completed fall 1955; modification of facilities to permit transition from B-36 to B-52 fall 1956, and from KC-97 to KC-135 operations 1957; 1,500 Wherry housing units completed or rehabilitated Nov 1960; GAM-77 Hound Dog missile facility completed Jun 1961; 114 Capehart housing units completed 8 Nov 1961; Caribou AFS, 3 mi NNW of Limestone, ME, absorbed by Loring AFB 1 Jul 1962; base supported B-52/KC-135 operations throughout 1960s and 1970s; facilities for SRAMs completed 1971-1972.

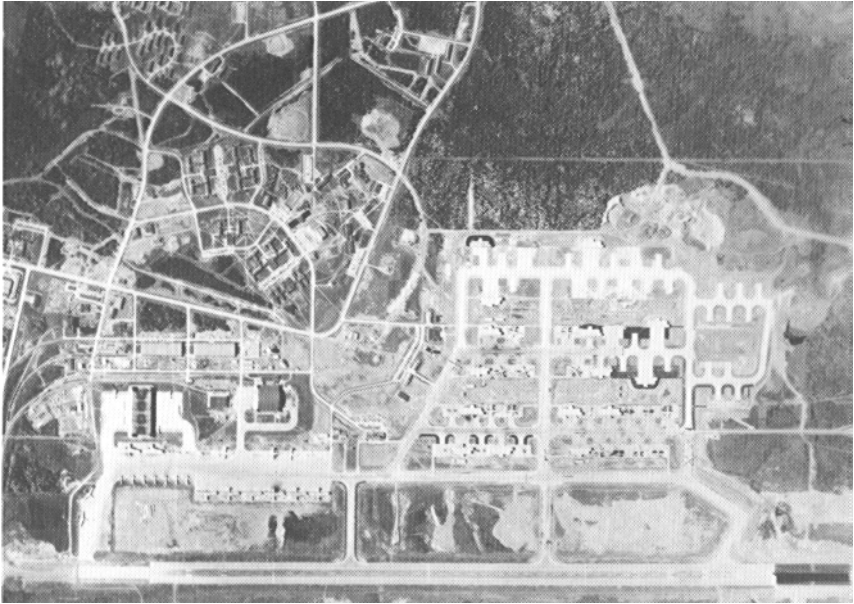

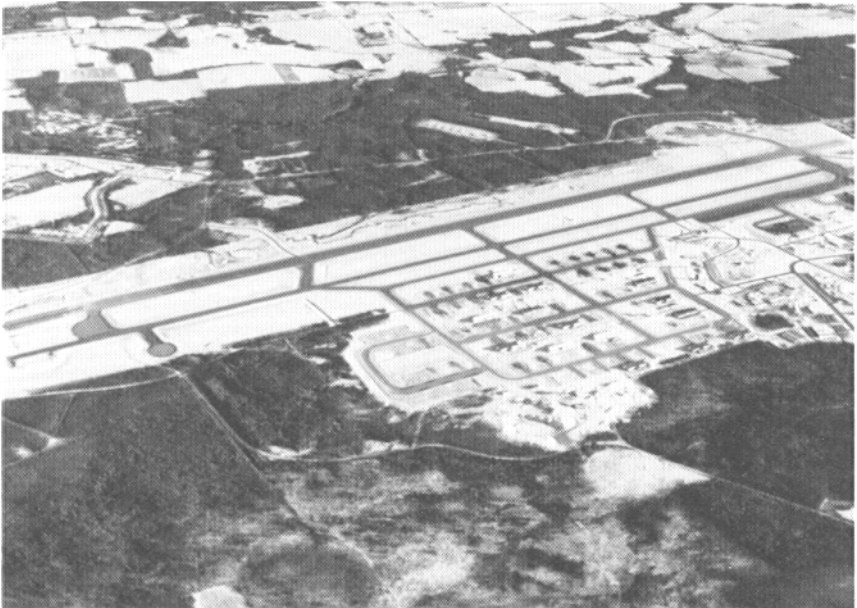
